I, Thomas R. Fisher, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, do declare and state as follows:

1. I am a Detective with the Denver Police Department. I have been with the Denver Police Department since January 1973. I was first cross-deputized as a Special Deputy United States Marshal in 1997, assigned to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF). I have been assigned to the JTTF continuously since that time, on a full-time basis. My only responsibilities as a law enforcement officer since 1997 have been as part of the JTTF. Since that time I have been exclusively under the direct supervision of FBI supervisors as part of the JTTF.

2. Beginning in approximately 1997, after I joined the JTTF, I undertook the responsibility of training local law enforcement officers regarding domestic terrorism issues, on behalf of the FBI. As part of this responsibility, several times a year I join with





On 4-17-99, Detectives Alonzo and Wattles, along with Det. Fisher, monitored two separate demonstrations, protesting the bombings in Yugoslavia, by NATO forces.			
The first demonstration was held at KUSA TV, Speer & Logan, at noon. This group numbered about 25 persons. There was a mix of people, some with Serbian ethnicity and others who appeared to be anti-war protesters. They displayed signs calling for the end to the bombings. Another group held anti-Clinton type signs and a large banner for a website, www.WeBelieveJuanita.com . This group calls for the resignation of President Clinton, due to the rape allegations made by [REDACTED], while Clinton was Governor of Arkansas.			
This group then went to the site of the second demonstration at 1 st Ave & University, where they mingled with the second group. This demonstration started at approximately 1:00pm and went until 3:30pm. The group numbered about 50 at one point, but had dwindled to about 6 people at 3:00pm.			
Both protests were peaceful.			
Det. Fisher spoke with one of the Serbian protesters and learned that similar demonstrations are being planned to be held on every Tuesday evening, but the locations are not presently known.

FBI Embroiled in 'Spy Files'

Feds sought intelligence on environmental rally in the Springs
Source: Colorado Springs Independent Article May 8-14, 2003

The Denver and Colorado Springs police departments aren't the only agencies that have collected intelligence about political activists in the Springs. The Federal Bureau of Investigations has, too.

In the first admission linking the FBI to the Denver Police Department's controversial "spy files," the agency confirmed this week that it had sought information on activists attending a protest rally in Colorado Springs in June of last year. An FBI anti-terrorism agent asked Springs police to provide him with the vehicle license-plate numbers of environmentalists who were picketing a timber-industry gathering at The Broadmoor hotel, confirmed Ann Atanasio, a spokeswoman for the FBI's Denver division.

The FBI also knew about the rally in advance and warned the industry group meeting at The Broadmoor that it might be targeted by protesters, the industry group's president said.



Most protests are peaceful events; however, a number of demonstrations, including the biannual International Monetary Fund and World Bank meetings, are more likely to be violent and disruptive and to require enhanced law enforcement security. Several effective and innovative strategies are commonly used by protestors prior to, during, and after demonstrations. The following tactics have been observed by U.S. and foreign law enforcement agencies while responding to criminal activities conducted during protests and demonstrations.

Protestors often use the internet to recruit, raise funds, and coordinate their activities prior to demonstrations. Activists may also make use of training camps to rehearse tactics and counter-strategies for dealing with the police and to resolve any logistical issues.

If a demonstration is going to take place in a secure facility, activists may seek to gain access to the site using false documentation. Surveillance of sites prior to demonstrations can allow activists to identify locations of command posts and law enforcement personnel in order to plan effective countermeasures.
