INCREASING VOTER PARTICIPATION IN LOW TURNOUT DISTRICT

House District 17 in Southeast Colorado Springs is a majority Black and Latine **district that has one of the lowest voter turnout rates** among 18- to 34-year-olds in Colorado.



Our initial work alongside Citizens Project in HD-17 this year was the start of **a multi-year effort to increase voter participation** in this part of Southeastern Colorado Springs.

The ACLU hosted a "Turn Up the Vote" event in Colorado Springs on October 29, 2022 to help encourage Black, Latine, and young voters to vote in the 2022 midterm election.

Their strategic leadership and partnership with the ACLU of Colorado was the foundation to We Are the Vote's success.

As part of We Are the Vote, ACLU of Colorado asked local artists to create artworks that would promote open discussion around the importance of voting. "Art the Vote" encourages Colorado creatives to express their voting-related emotions through their artistic practice.

RAISING AWARENESS OF KEY CIVIL RIGHTS ISSUES ON THE BALLOT

We engaged a variety of strategies to ensure that the media, candidates, and voters understood the essential issues in this election, including:

- 1. Commissioned a statewide poll on civil rights issues.
- 2. Used data to inform our voter education work.

3. Developed a **ballot guide** that included information on seven ballot measures that addressed key ACLU issues.

SUPPORTING SOLUTIONS TO DENVER'S HOUSING CRISIS

Denver is experiencing an **access to housing crisis** that disproportionately impacts communities of color and causes a cascade of civil rights and civil liberties abuses for unhoused people.

The ACLU was proud to **support NEWR Denver**, an initiative that would have **reduced unjust evictions** and **kept Denver's families in their homes** with a major paid digital ad campaign, door-to-door canvassing, and opinion columns.



Although the initiative fell short this year, the ACLU and partners will **not stop fighting** for equitable access to housing.

LOOKING AHEAD TO UPCOMING ELECTIONS

ACLU of Colorado's **We Are the Vote** is only getting started.

In future years, we plan to build upon and deepen our work with partners all over the state **committed to removing barriers to participation for historically disenfranchised voters**. We will expand our education on critical civil rights and civil liberties issues in candidate races and ballot initiatives.
