

The first demonstration was held at KUSA TV, Speer & Logan, at noon. This group numbered about 25 persons. There was a mix of people, some with Serbian ethnicity and others who appeared to be anti-war protesters. They displayed signs calling for the end to the bombings. Another group held anti-Clinton type signs and a large banner for a website, www.WeBelieveJuanita.com. This group calls for the resignation of President Clinton, due to the rape allegations made by while Clinton was Governor of Arkansas.

This group then went to the site of the second demonstration at 1st Ave & University, where they mingled with the second group. This demonstration started at approximately 1:00pm and went until 3:30pm. The group numbered about 50 at one point, but had dwindled to about 6 people at 3:00pm.





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

FBI Embroiled in 'Spy Files'

Feds sought intelligence on environmental rally in the Springs

The Denver and Colorado Springs police departments aren't the only agencies that have collected intelligence about political activists in the Springs. The Federal Bureau of Investigations has, too.

In the first admission linking the FBI to the Denver Police Department's controversial "spy files," the agency confirmed this week that it had sought information on activists attending a protest rally in Colorado Springs in June of last year. An FBI anti-terrorism agent asked Springs police to provide him with the vehicle license-plate numbers of environmentalists who were picketing a timber-industry gathering at The Broadmoor hotel, confirmed Ann Atanasio, a spokeswoman for the FBI's Denver division.

The FBI also knew about the rally in advance and warned the industry group meeting at The Broadmoor that it might be targeted by protesters, the industry group's president said.

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



LAW ENFORCEMENT SENSITIVE

VIOLENT GANG AND TERRORIST ORGANIZATION FILE (VGOTF)

Due to the increase need for safety for the 2002 Olympics and the necessity for increased information sharing with law enforcement, the FBI is compiling a list of individuals who might impose a risk to the Olympics or the security of the United States.

The list will included the names and personal identifiers of individuals who are currently the subject of certain FBT investigations. The categories of individuals entered will include: 1) Anarchists, 2) Militia, 3) White Supremacist, 4) Black Extremist, 5) Animal; Rights Extremist, 6) Environmental Extremist, 7) Domestic Extremist, 8) Radical Islamic Extremist, 9) European Origin Extremist, 10) Latin Origin Extremist, 11) Asian Origin Extremist.

If an officer would query NCIC as to one of these individuals in the above categories, the following screen would appear.

"WARNING-APPROACH WITH CAUTION. HOWEVER MAKE NO EFFORT TO ARREST INDIVIDUAL UNLESS THERE IS EVIDENCE OF A VIOLATION OF FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL STATUTE)S). ONCE AN INDIVIDUAL IS IDENTIFIED WITHIN THIS SYSTEM, CONDUCT ALL LOGICAL INVESTIGATION UTILIZING TECHNIQUES AUTHORIZED IN YOUR JURISDICTION. DO NOT ALERT THE INDIVIDUAL TO THE FBI'S INTEREST AND CONTACT YOUR LOCAL FBI FIELD OFFICE AT THE EARLIEST OPPORTUNITY."

As stated above, all Denver Police officers should use extreme caution if one these individuals is contacted, but should be intensely cognizant of the potential sensitivity of the nature of the investigation as not to alert the individual or a third person as to their being the subject of a FBI investigation. The individuals on this list are subjects of ongoing counterterrorism inquiries, of which the information that the officer might obtain could be immensely important.

If a "hit" on one of these individuals occurs, the Denver FBI office can be contacted by the radio room or the officer may call (303) 629-7171.

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



ITEM: TACTICS USED DURING PROTESTS AND DEMONSTRATIONS

On October 25, 2003, mass marches and rallies against the occupation in Iraq are scheduled to occur in Washington, D.C. and San Francisco, California. While the FBI possesses no information indicating that violent or terrorist activities are being planned as part of these protests, the possibility exists that elements of the activist community may attempt to engage in violent, destructive, or disruptive acts. Most protests are peaceful events; however, a number of demonstrations, including the biannual International Monetary Fund and World Bank meetings, are more likely to be violent and disruptive and to require enhanced law enforcement security. Several effective and innovative strategies are commonly used by protestors prior to, during, and after demonstrations. The following tactics have been observed by U.S. and foreign law enforcement agencies while responding to criminal activities conducted during protests and demonstrations.

Protestors often use the internet to recruit, raise funds, and coordinate their activities prior to demonstrations. Activists may also make use of training camps to rehearse tactics and counter-strategies for dealing with the police and to resolve any logistical issues.

If a demonstration is going to take place in a secure facility, activists may seek to gain access to the site using false documentation. Surveillance of sites prior to demonstrations can allow activists to identify locations of command posts and law enforcement personnel in order to plan effective countermeasures

Traditional demonstration tactics by which protestors draw attention to their causes include marches, banners, and forms of passive resistance such as sit-ins. Extremist elements may engage in more aggressive tactics that can include vandalism, physical harassment of delegates. trespassing, the formation of human chains or shields, makeshift barricades, devices used against nounted police units, and the use of weapons-such as projectiles and homemade bombs. Ever the more peaceful techniques can create a climate of disorder, block access to a site, draw large numbers of police officers to a specific location in order to weaken security at other locations. obstruct traffic, and possibly intimidate people from attending the events being protested.

During the course of a demonstration, activists often communicate with one another using cell phones or radios to coordinate activities or to undate colleagues about ongoing events. Other types of media equipment (video cameras, photographic equipment, audio tape recorders, microphones, and computer and radio equipment) may be used for documenting potential cases of police brutality and for distribution of information over the internet.

Extremists may be prepared to defend themselves against law enforcement officials during the course of a demonstration. Masks (gas masks, goggles, scarves, scuba masks, filter masks, and sunglasses) can serve to minimize the effects of tear gas and pepper spray as well as obscure one's identity. Extremists may also employ shields (trash can lids, sheets of plexiglass, truck tire inner tubes, etc.) and body protection equipment (layered elething, hard hats and helmets, sporting equipment, life jackets, etc.) to protect themselves during marches. Activists may also use intimidation techniques such as videotaping and the swarming of police officers to hinder the arrest of other demonstrators.

After demonstrations, activists are usually reluctant to cooperate with law enforcement officials. They seldom carry any identification papers and often refuse to divulge any information about themselves or other protestors. Post-demonstration activities can include fundraising in support of the legal defense of accused protestors and demonstrations of solidarity calling for the release of the accused.

Law enforcement agencies should be alert to these possible indicators of protest activity and report any potentially illegal acts to the nearest FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force.






