On 4-17-99, Detectives Alonzo and Wattles, along with Det. Fisher, monitored two separate demonstrations, protesting the bombings in Yugoslavia, by NATO forces.

The first demonstration was held at KUSA TV, Speer & Logan, at noon. This group numbered about 25 persons. There was a mix of people, some with Serbian ethnicity and others who appeared to be anti-war protesters. They displayed signs calling for the end to the bombings. Another group held anti-Clinton type signs and a large banner for a website, [www.WeBelieveJuanita.com](http://www.WeBelieveJuanita.com). This group calls for the resignation of President Clinton, due to the rape allegations made by [REDACTED], while Clinton was Governor of Arkansas.

This group then went to the site of the second demonstration at 1<sup>st</sup> Ave & University, where they mingled with the second group. This demonstration started at approximately 1:00pm and went until 3:30pm. The group numbered about 50 at one point, but had dwindled to about 6 people at 3:00pm.

Both protests were peaceful.

Det. Fisher spoke with one of the Serbian protesters and learned that similar demonstrations are being planned to be held on every Tuesday evening, but the locations are not presently known.

Two older W/M's in business attire occupied this vehicle. They were observed  
At both locations, talking with the protesters, but not actively involved in the protest.

This vehicle was at both locations and transported protesters from the 1<sup>st</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> sight.

The group passed out flyers for the International Action Center in New York. This is run by Ramsey  
Clark, former US Attorney General. The website address is: <http://www.iacenter.org>. This organization is  
also involved in protesting the Iraq war and the death penalty case.  
The website lists all demonstrations world wide to protest the bombings in Yugoslavia.
